In vitro granulocytic progenitors have been shown to suppress some aspects of the T-cell mediated immune response. In particular, these progenitors are able to inhibit the cytotoxicity of natural killer (NK) cells and cytotoxic T cells. In addition, a suppressed granulocytic response has been described in vitro after exposure to certain tumour antigens and an effective immunotherapeutic approach to certain solid tumours has been reported in vitro. In the present study we investigated the effect of conditioned medium derived from one of these tumour cell lines (BW 5147) on the phagocytic activity of a human monocytic cell line (U937). As a means of manipulating myeloid cell maturation, normal human monocytes were cultured for 3 days in the presence of recombinant human granulocyte-macrophage colony-stimulating factor. The conditioned medium was then added to the monocyte/U937 cell cocultures. The addition of the conditioned medium inhibited the phagocytosis of sheep erythrocytes by U937 cells by 58 +/- 3%. We propose that this inhibitory effect may reflect the presence in the medium of factors that influence myeloid cell maturation.
