

NR 505 Week 5 Research Summary Assignment

Research summaries belong to the group of the most demanding academic assignments. They require prioritization and synthesis of the most relevant information. It is [custom writing paper](#) to understand the definitions and current knowledge of the subject, make notes and check your work against the original research paper.

The methods section should describe actions taken to conduct the study, such as interviews, surveys and observations. It should also explain how the data was analyzed and what conclusions were drawn.

Introduction

Research papers are written to share results from scientific investigations with the academic community. However, executive summaries and research reports are often developed for external stakeholders (for example, funders or organizations that participated in the study). This assignment allows students to practice writing about the contents of large-scale research studies for non-academic audiences.

This can be difficult, but asking yourself a few basic questions as you begin to write can help. These questions include: Why was this research done? How was the data collected? Methods

While this may seem easy, creating a research summary is a more demanding task than it looks.

The next step is to skim through the article to find the most important aspects. This will include the title, abstract, and method section.
